THE HEEADSSS ASSESSMENT

23 FEBRUARY, 23 MARCH, 24 MAY, 19 JUNE, 18 JULY

A one day introduction to clinical practice in youth health including: communication and engagement in youth health and development and using the HEEADSSS assessment model.

WHAT COMES AFTER HEEADSSS?

11 APRIL, 28 SEPTEMBER

This one day course gives an introduction to intervention skills when working with young people such as problem solving, motivational interviewing and discussing principles of behaviour change in young people.

POSTGRADUATE STUDY IN YOUTH HEALTH

CLINICAL YOUTH HEALTH (PAEDS 712)

Semester One: Core skills in youth health including: effective engagement, assessment and intervention skills for working with young people in a range of clinical or community settings. This course has some content completed on line, with 3 contact days.

TEACHING DAYS: 15 MARCH, 16 MARCH & 11 APRIL

POPULATION YOUTH HEALTH (POPLHLTH 732)

Semester One: This course aims to prepare students for a role in youth health in a variety of locations and sectors. In doing this, students are exposed to current research and practice relating to population youth health and evidence-based health care. This course is taught with a blend of on-line and on campus delivery (1 day).

TEACHING DAYS: 27 MAY

YOUTH CARE PRACTICUM (PAEDS 722)

Semester One or Two: In 2017 there will be a structured practicum offered in semester 1—*Adolescent and young adult cancer*. This is designed to be taken alongside PAEDS 712. Other options for practicums developed by students can be undertaken following discussion with academic staff.

HEALTH, EDUCATION AND YOUTH DEVELOPMENT (PAEDS 719)

Semester Two: This course offers insights and strategies to work with young people in the rapidly developing health and education sector interface. It is taught with a blend of on-line and on campus delivery (2 days). This course is highly relevant for health professionals working in schools.

TEACHING DAYS: 28 JULY & 13 OCTOBER

YOUTH HEALTH THEORY, APPLICATION & LEADERSHIP (PAEDS 720)

Semester Two: This course aims to extend participants knowledge of youth health and well-being and prepare participants for leadership roles in youth health. Participants will expand their knowledge of the theory of youth development and study examples of effective youth development programs. Participants will develop and present a youth health project in their field of work. Students will be taught the necessary knowledge, skills and attitudes to support their leadership in the development of their project.

TEACHING DAYS: 31 JULY, 1 AUGUST, 18 SEPTEMBER & 9 OCTOBER
