LEVEL 3: KEYWORKER CO-ORDINATION

LEVEL 4: KEYWORKER MANAGEMENT

Individualised and intensive support from the regional keyworker with MDT / multiagency involvement

All of Level 2 & 3 Plus:

- Intensive case management
- Youth development approach adopted
- 1:1 youth work & whānau support
- Wider coordinated multiagency / multidisciplinary involvement Key worker attendance at
- hospital appointments wherever possible
- Flexible service and delivery model

Psychosocial needs should be reassessed regularly using the various tools available,

If there is a change in the AYA's disease or treatment factors or any member of the care team have concerns about unmet psychosocial needs then contact the regional AYA Keyworker.
